Re: Assembly Bill 1568 - OPPOSE

Dear Chairman Schultz, Vice Chairman Alanis and Members of the Public Safety Committee:

The Alliance for Constitutional Sex Offense Laws requests that you vote no on Assembly Bill 1568 which is scheduled to be considered on March 3 by the Public Safety Committee. As currently written, that bill would decrease public safety as well as harm tens of thousands of individuals who are eligible to petition for removal from the sex offender registry.


First, the bill would decrease public safety because it would defeat the main purpose of the Tiered Registry Law (SB 384) which this committee supported prior to its passage. That is, the Tiered Registry Law was enacted to make law enforcement more efficient by removing the requirement to monitor individuals who do not pose a current danger to the public.

Second, the bill would harm tens of thousands of individuals who are eligible to petition for removal from the sex offender registry. Some of these individuals, including those assigned to Tier 2, were placed on parole many years before CASOMB began to certify treatment programs. Additional groups of individuals who would be harmed are those convicted out of state, in military courts or in federal courts because none of those individuals were required or even eligible to complete CASOMB-certified treatment programs.

Finally, AB 1568 would allow judges to order individuals otherwise eligible to petition for removal from the registry to undergo evaluation by a government official regarding his risk level. There is no provision in the bill regarding who would pay for those evaluations, however, some entity within the government – perhaps the courts -- would be required to pay for the evaluations.

Thank you for your attention to this important issue. For the reasons stated above, we request that you vote no on Assembly Bill 1568.
